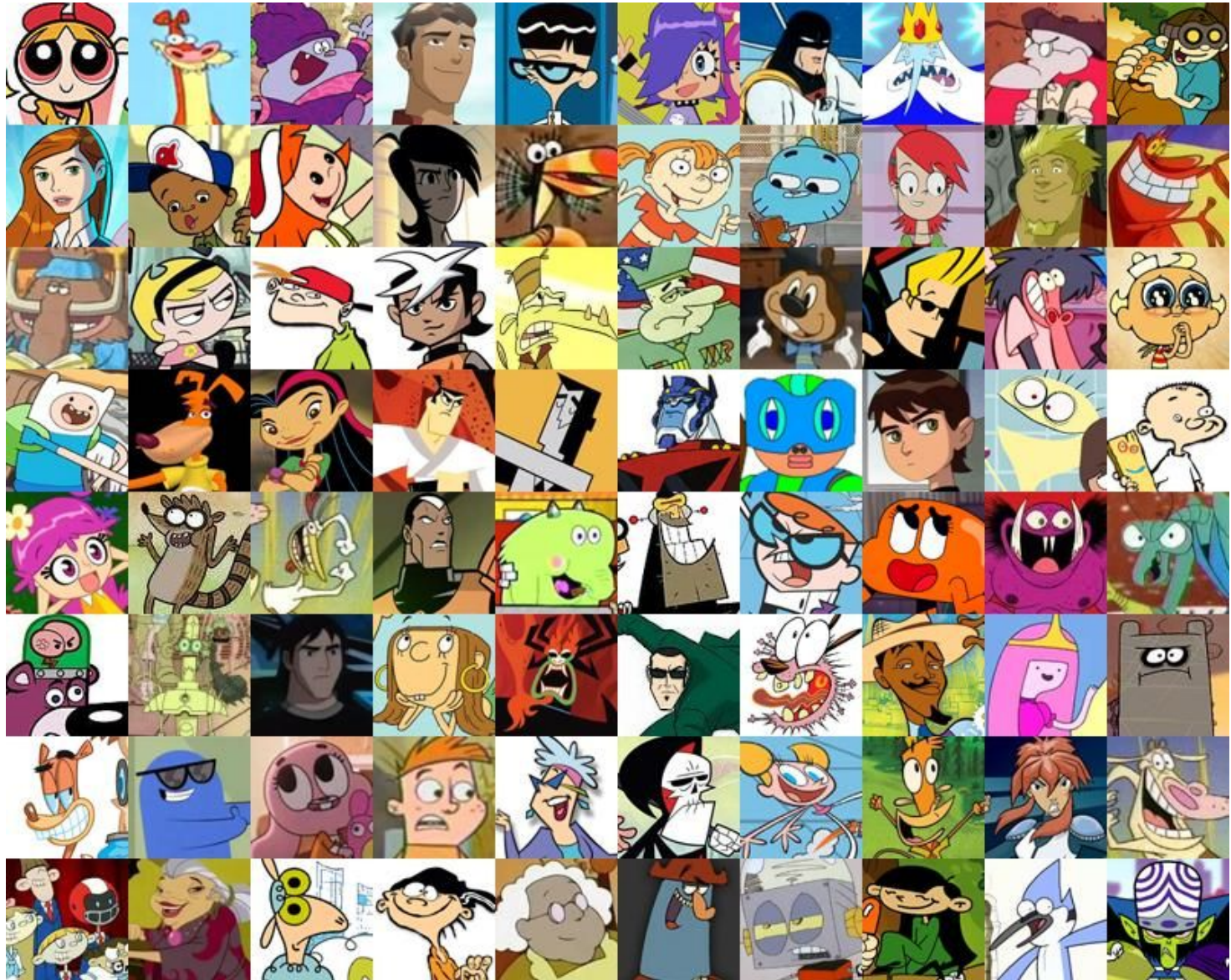

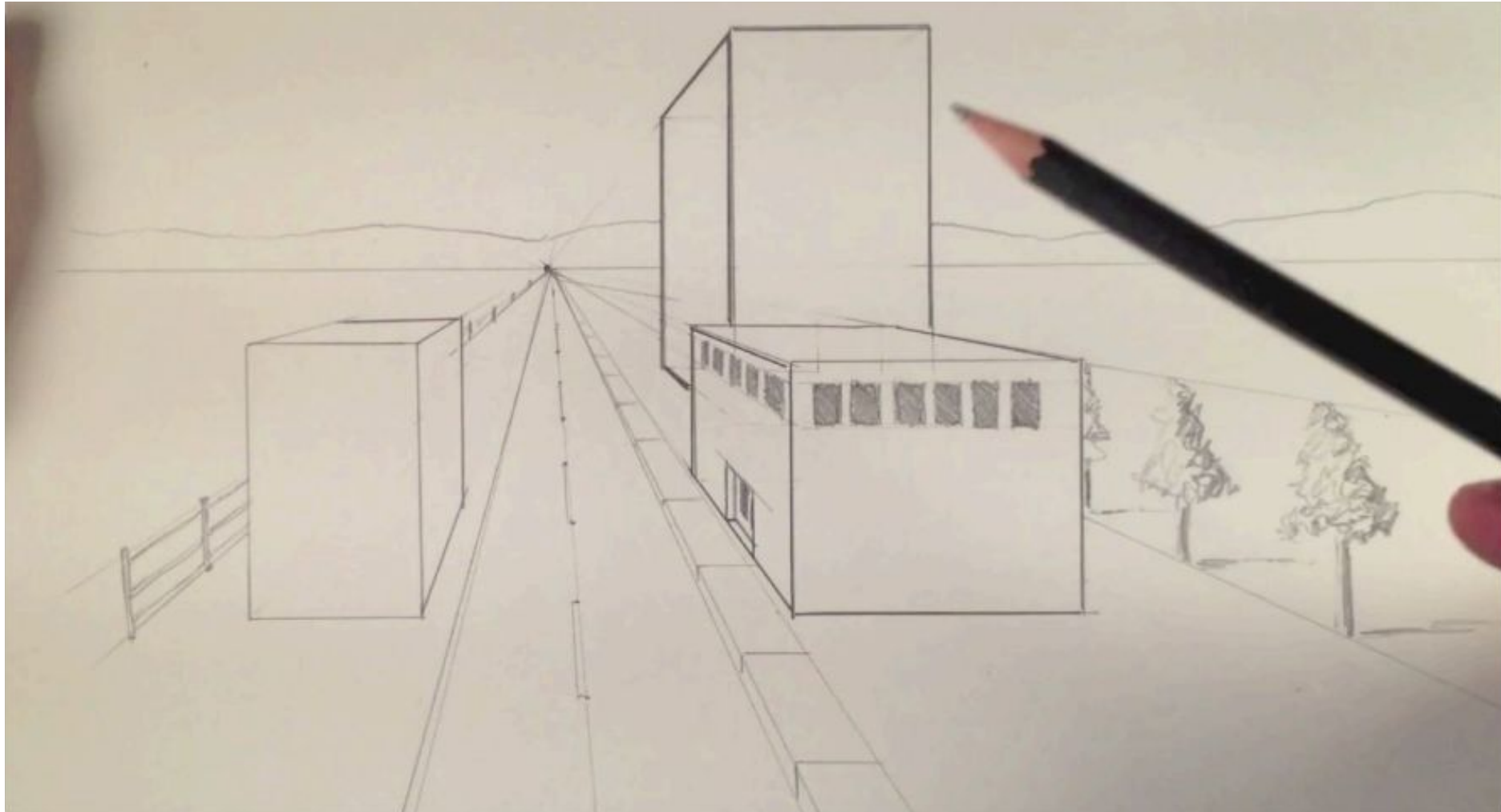

Accuracy of Perspective (20 points):

- The drawing effectively demonstrates one-point perspective, with all lines converging towards a single vanishing point.
- Horizontal lines (e.g., tops and bottoms of buildings, the street) are parallel to the horizon line.

Composition and Theme Representation (20 points):

- The layout of 4 buildings, trees, fence, and other elements supports the chosen theme effectively.
- The theme is clearly identifiable and enhances the overall composition of the drawing.

Detail and Realism (20 points):

- Buildings exhibit realistic architectural features such as windows, doors, and textures.
- Trees are depicted with identifiable foliage, branches, and trunks.
- The fence is depicted with appropriate structure and detail.

Theme Integration (15 points):

- The chosen theme is integrated cohesively throughout the drawing, with elements that contribute to the theme's narrative or mood.
- Personalized details related to the theme are present and enhance the overall storytelling of the scene.

Use of Color or Shading (15 points):

- Effective use of color or shading techniques to enhance depth, mood, and atmosphere.
- Colors are chosen thoughtfully to complement the chosen theme and create visual interest.

Neatness and Craftsmanship (10 points):

- Lines are clean, precise, and well-defined.
- The drawing demonstrates attention to detail and craftsmanship, with no visible smudges or errors.
- Personalization is evident in the execution of details.

Creativity and Originality (10 points):

- The drawing demonstrates creativity and originality in the interpretation of the theme and depiction of elements.
- Unique elements or perspectives are incorporated that set the drawing apart and engage the viewer.

Overall Presentation (10 points):

- The drawing is presented neatly on suitable paper
- It is appropriately sized and centered within the frame.
- The student's name and date are included on the artwork.
